

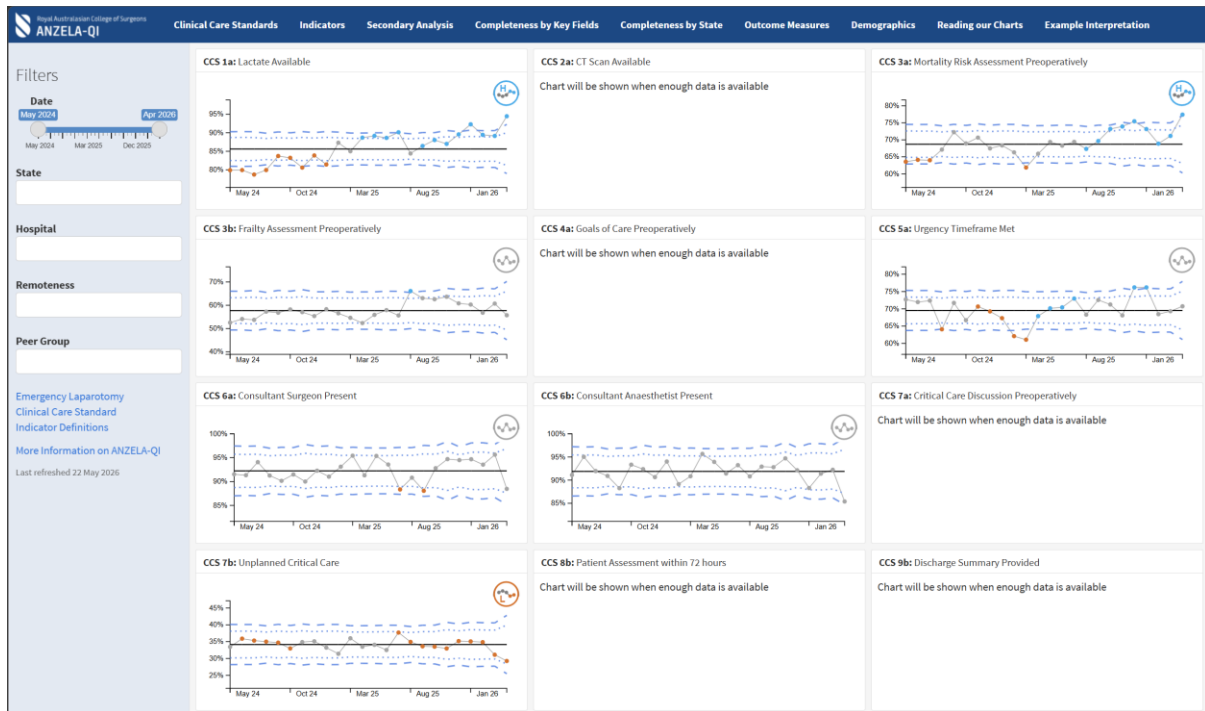

ANZELA-QI Dashboard User Guide

Once you have accessed the ANZELA-QI Dashboard, you will be launched into the Emergency Laparotomy (EL) Clinical Care Standard (CCS) indicators quick view page. This page is a summary of how ANZELA data trends over time using Statistical Process Control (SPC) charts for the CCS Indicators.



Filters:


The filter panel on the left-hand side can be used to restrict the data in the charts on a given page.

Filters can be searched, click into the text box and start typing to search.

Each page has multiple filters that may clash with each other, if you have already filtered for a specific state, you cannot add a filter for a hospital outside that state

If you select multiple inputs, use backspace to delete unwanted values.

A blank box means that all possible values are included.




Selecting a hospital from the hospital filter, will show only that hospital's data.

Selecting a State, Remoteness, or Peer Group will show the sum of multiple hospitals data within the selected group.

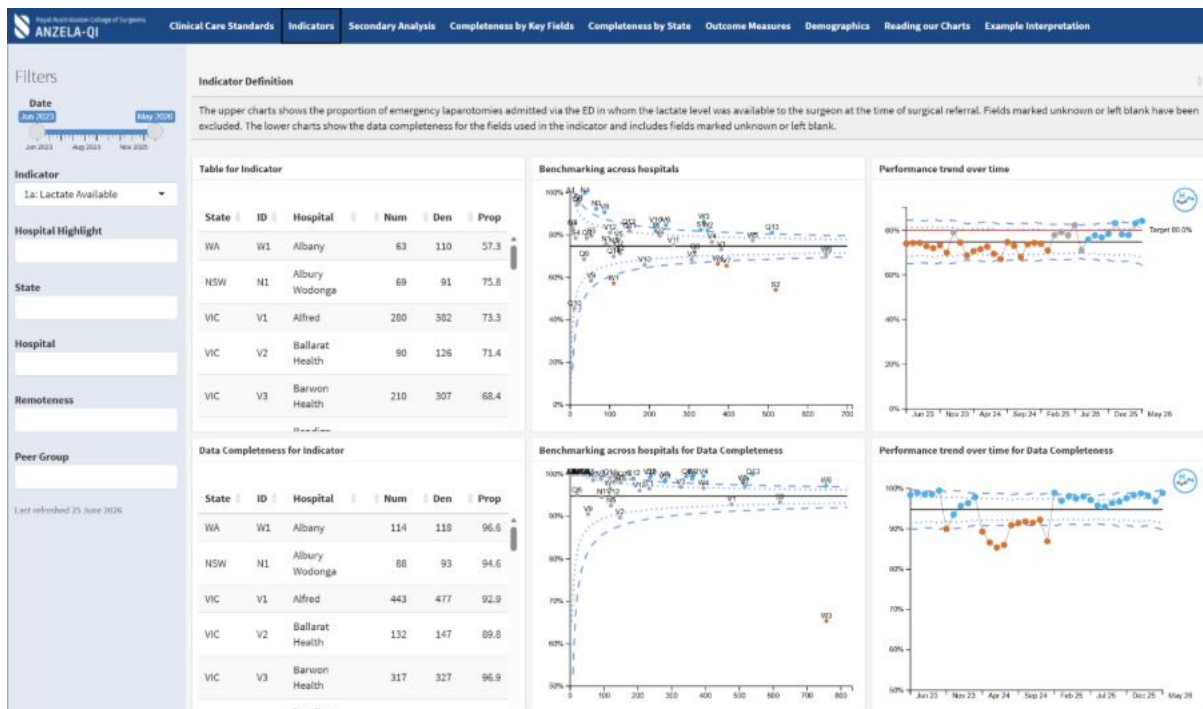
Indicators:

Navigating to the Indicators tab shows a more detailed view of the CCS.

The filters panel has gained a new dropdown, to select a single indicator to review and a hospital highlight dropdown, to highlight where your hospital is on the funnel plot.

The top row of three charts show the current position of the selected CCS indicator. The middle chart is a funnel plot, and shows the position of each hospital compared to each other. Each hospital can be hovered for more information, or found in the left lookup table.

The bottom row of three charts show the data completeness for the selected indicator. Data completeness is used to inform on the accuracy of the data fields that are used in calculating an indicator. When a hospital has low completeness, the data may not accurately reflect its true value, use caution when analysing those sites.



The Secondary Analysis and Outcome Measures tabs are copies of the Indicators tab. They display indicators outside of the CCS and are intended to be updated with user feedback and requests.

Data Completeness:

This tab shows the data completeness for selected fields that are used in calculating the EL Clinical Care Standard Indicators grouped by state/territory to allow for comparison. The filter panel has been replaced with a variable selector to swap between data fields.
