Chair's Message

I extend a warm greeting to all our Section members. Rural health remains a goal of the RACS Council. The Rural Surgery Section committee tabled its paper on the '[Select for Rural](#)' Initiative, the first part of its strategic plan, to the [Board of Surgical Education and Training](#) meeting held on 12 June and subsequently to the June [Education Board](#) meeting. The presentation of the Rural Surgery Section committee's strategy was further acknowledged by the [Council](#) at its the June meeting.

Each Training Board has been asked to report back on the extent to which they will adopt the initiatives, and if not then why not. Discussion by the Education Board ensured there is high level input and support for the Select for Rural Initiative. RACS are investigating and reviewing options on how RACS and its portfolios can best address the equitable distribution of the surgical workforce. The Rural Surgery Section committee are presently working on recommendations for the 'Train for Rural' Initiative, which forms the second part of the strategic plan.

It is widely known that the communities in Alice Springs and NT at large are under-served and the health services have struggled with recruiting talent. With the long-standing surgeon Dr Jacob on the verge of retiring, an exciting specialist consultant vacancy at Alice Springs Hospital to join the Surgical Department has arisen. The role description is detailed [below](#). Applicants interested in 3, 6- or 12-months stints are welcome, though long term recruitment is most preferred. It is a great opportunity for younger general surgery Fellows to consider since overseas fellowships may not be as readily available due to COVID-19.

While the infection has been largely kept at bay from our rural, regional and remote communities, state & border forced closures have impacted our border towns. The COVID-19 flare-ups in Victoria and NSW are a stark reminder that the pandemic is not behind us. As we readjust to the new normal, the RACS information hub has up-to-date information and resources for wellbeing and mental health. These are [listed below](#) for your convenience.


