

# **MALT Committee member vacancies**

There is currently one vacant role on the MALT Committee:

• Specialist International Medical Graduate (SIMG)

This document outlines the requirements of the role, the process of expressing an interest and the process of determining the successful candidates.

## Background

The MALT Committee is an advisory group charged with the responsibility of providing leadership and strategic direction for the Morbidity Audit and Logbook Tool (MALT) managed by the Morbidity Audits Team in the Research, Audit and Academic Surgery (RAAS) Division of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons (RACS).

### **Committee objectives**

- To provide strategic direction and advice related to the development and maintenance of the system
- To provide guidance and feedback to ensure that MALT continues to meet the needs of RACS membership and relevant stakeholders such as training boards and specialty societies
- To promote collaboration with specialty groups.

#### **Duties and responsibilities**

- To provide guidance and advice related to the development and maintenance of MALT.
- Be available to provide clinical advice to the Morbidity Audits Team in relation to MALT.
- To promote the use of MALT amongst RACS members and RACS specialty training boards
- Be familiar with the system and its main features
- To attend scheduled meetings and actively contribute for the duration of the tenure (2-3 years).

#### Expression of interest criteria

The MALT Committee seek expressions of interest for the listed vacant role. To be considered, it is essential that you use MALT and meet the criteria below:

- Specialist International Medical Graduate (SIMG): currently undertaking a Specialist Pathway in Australia or the Vocational Pathway in New Zealand.
- Preferably only a short way through or have recently commenced the SIMG process.

#### Submission and selection process

To submit an expression of interest, please prepare a brief statement of how you meet the specific criteria including the specialty practiced and email to <u>malt@surgeons.org</u>

All submissions will be reviewed by the Morbidity Audit Team for suitability then forwarded to the MALT Committee for consideration. All candidates will receive notification of the outcome.
