1. PURPOSE AND SCOPE

As a Fellowship based organisation, RACS is committed to excellence in surgical education and practice. To assist this, RACS will provide funding for scientific visitors of note from Australia, New Zealand and internationally to attend specialty society, association and subspecialty conferences.

2. KEYWORDS

Scientific visitors, named lectures, ASMs, Professional Development, Fellowship Services, Conferences, Sponsorship

3. BODY OF POLICY

3.1. Background

RACS is keen to enhance the ongoing education of surgeons within Australia and New Zealand. Attracting outstanding speakers to the regular scientific meetings of all surgical specialties and sub-specialties is an important component of this.

RACS provides support to its premier meeting (Annual Scientific Congress) through the ASC Visitors fund which is a corpus of funds within RACS, from which the budgeted income stream from the investments covers the costs of visitors to the ASC program. The ASC Visitors program covers travel, accommodation and registration of the Visitor and is determined annually through the budget cycle.

Separate to that, it is recognised that Fellows within sub-specialties and other groups wish to enhance their meetings by inviting visitors of note, from Australia, New Zealand or internationally. RACS will support these initiatives through the RACS Visitors Grant Program.

3.2. Requirements for application

- 3.2.1. The RACS Visitor grant must be used to cover the cost of travel, accommodation and registration of the visitor. The size of the grant requested must be commensurate with these costs but will be limited to the amount determined by Council (\$16,000 in 2019) of base funding and adjusted depending on the origin of the visitor.
- 3.2.2. The base funding will be adjusted according to the origin of the visitor (for meetings in Australia or New Zealand): Australasia 40% of base Asia-Pacific 70% of base, rest of the world 100%).
- 3.2.3. From its yearly operating budget (Subscription based) RACS will make available a limited number of RACS Visitor Grants. The funding amount will be confirmed by Council at the October meeting of each year for the calendar year, fifteen months ahead.
- 3.2.4. Applications are open to any affiliated surgical society or association of Surgeons
- 3.2.5. Applications will be open between 1 February and the third Monday in March for meetings in the following year.

3.5. Oversight

The Grants allocation will be overseen by the Fellowship Services Committee, and confirmed by the PDSB Executive. The success of the speaker grant and completion of requirements will be reviewed by the Fellowship Services Committee. If the conditions are not met, then no further grants may be made.

The Manager of Fellowship Services will be the staff member responsible for informing groups of the availability of funds, managing the application process with oversight by the Chair of the Committee and providing reports as appropriate to PDSB and Council.

3.6. Cancelled meetings/speakers

If the conference or meeting is not held or the speaker does not attend, the grant is returned to RACS. It cannot be held for another event.
