- <u>R C Bennett Prize</u>: awarded to the best laboratory based research paper submitted by either a Victorian based medical student, unaccredited registrar, or accredited trainee.
- <u>DCAS Scholarship</u>: awarded to Victorian medical students whose paper demonstrates a real interest and potential in academic surgery, and who will most benefit from attending the DCAS course.
- <u>Medical Student Prize</u>: the best presentation by a Victorian medical student.
- <u>Best Poster Prize</u>: awarded to the poster submission judged best for presentation.
