Eligibility summary RACS Fellows, SIMGs, SET Trainees

Interest area Colorectal surgery

The Murray and Unity Pheils Colorectal Travel Grant supports surgeons and Trainees to obtain further training and experience in the field of colorectal surgery. The grant enables a RACS Fellow or Trainee to undertake colorectal surgery training overseas.

The Murray and Unity Pheils Colorectal Travel Grant was established following a donation made by the late Professor Murray Pheils, FRACS.

Conditions

This guideline outlines information specific to the respective grant's purpose, duration, conditions and recipient eligibility. For all the conditions for this scholarship it is essential that you also read the Learning and Development Policy.

Applicant eligibility

Applications are open to RACS Fellows, Specialist International Medical Graduates (SIMGs) and SET Trainees.

Eligible activity

The grant funds international travel to obtain further training and experience at a specialist colorectal unit.

Selection process

Preference will be given to applicants who are permanent residents or citizens of Australia and Aotearoa New Zealand.

The selection panel is comprised of the Chair (or nominee) and two members of the ANZ Scholarship and Grant Committee.

Financial arrangements

The grant funding will be paid to the recipient following receipt of a valid tax invoice as requested by the Scholarships and Grants department. Payment will be made in one instalment before 1 March in the grant activity year.

Funding source

This grant is funded from income derived from the Murray & Unity Pheils Travelling Fellowship corpus under the Foundation for Surgery
