Richard Jepson Research Scholarship

The Richard Jepson Research Scholarship supports deserving researchers, early in their career. The late Professor Richard P Jepson was the foundation Chair for Surgery at the University of Adelaide. His wife, Dr Mary Jepson, established this scholarship for his honour, as Professor Jepson strongly believed that youth needs support and opportunity.

Conditions

Applicant eligibility

Applications are open to SET Trainees who are enrolled (or intend to enrol) in a higher degree such as a Masters or PhD. Recipients must still be a SET Trainee in the scholarship year and not have completed their Fellowship requirements.

Eligible activity

A research project undertaken as part of a higher degree at an approved research institute under the supervision of an experienced investigator.

Selection

Selection is via assessment of the written application with shortlisted applicants invited to interview.

The selection panel is comprised of the incumbent RP. Jepson Professor of Surgery, University of Adelaide's School of Medicine and the Chair (or their nominee) and one other member of the ANZ Scholarship and Grant Committee (ANZSGC).

Recipient obligations

Recipients are required to present their research at the annual meeting of the Surgical Research Society of Australasia (or an agreed equivalent) at least once, during the scholarship period or within the 12 months following the scholarship period.
