Governing Policy: Research Scholarship Policy

Brendan Dooley and Gordon Trinca Trauma Research Scholarship

The Brendan Dooley and Gordon Trinca Trauma Research Scholarship encourages surgeons, Trainees and medical scientists to undertake research into the prevention and treatment of trauma injuries in Australia and Aotearoa New Zealand.

Conditions

Applicant eligibility

Applications are open to RACS Fellows, Specialist International Medical Graduates (SIMGs), SET Trainees and non-RACS medical scientists who are sponsored by a RACS Fellow.

SET applicants who are not accepted into the SET program may still be considered for this scholarship if they meet the criteria of being a non-RACS medical scientist who is sponsored by a RACS Fellow.

Eligible activity

Research into the prevention and treatment of trauma injuries in Australia and Aotearoa New Zealand. Research is to be undertaken at an approved research institution under the supervision of an experienced investigator.

Application criteria

Applicants are required to submit a statement summarising their personal experience in obtaining and delivering trauma research projects and the anticipated future contribution they will make to the prevention and treatment of trauma injuries in Australia and Aoteroa New Zealand.

Selection

Selection is via assessment of the written application only.

The selection panel is comprised of:

- the Chair (or their nominee) and one other member of the ANZ Scholarship and Grant Committee
- the Chair (or their nominee) and one other member of the Trauma Committee.

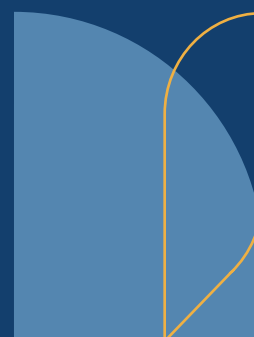

Recipient obligations

Recipients are required to present their research at the annual meeting of the Surgical Research Society of Australasia (or an agreed equivalent), at least once, during the scholarship period or within 12 months following the scholarship period.

Reapplication

Recipients can only receive this scholarship once.

Financial arrangements

The scholarship will be paid directly to the recipient, upon receipt of a valid tax invoice as requested by the Scholarships and Grants department. Payment will be made in one instalment prior to 1 March in the scholarship year.

This scholarship consists of a stipend only.
