Governing Policy: Research Scholarship Policy

Professor Philip Walker Vascular Surgery Research Scholarship

The Professor Philip Walker Vascular Surgery Research Scholarship supports research within a higher degree, in an area related to vascular disease.

Professor Walker, past Professor of Clinical Surgery and Head of Academic Discipline of Surgery at the University of Queensland, was a pre-eminent teacher, researcher and clinically active vascular surgeon who served as an examiner in Vascular Surgery for RACS. He died following illness at a time when he was still very active in his areas of interest. This scholarship is funded by a generous bequest from Professor Walker.

Conditions

Applicant eligibility

Applications are open to RACS Fellows, Specialist International Medical Graduates (SIMGs), SET Trainees and SET applicants who are enrolled (or intend to enrol) in a higher degree such as a Masters or PhD with research related to vascular surgery.

Eligible activity

Higher degree research related to vascular surgery, undertaken at an approved research institute.

Selection

Selection is assessed via written application.

The selection panel is comprised of the Chair (or their nominee) and two members of ANZ Scholarship and Grant Committee (ANZSGC).

Recipient obligations

Recipients are required to present their research at the annual meeting of the Surgical Research Society of Australasia, at least once, during the scholarship period or within 12 months following the scholarship period.

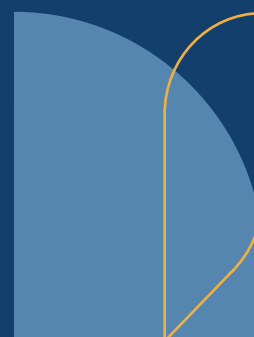
