Governing Policy: Learning and Development Grants

Skills Training Faculty Grant

The Skills Training Faculty Grant provides a professional development opportunity to senior Skills Training Faculty in recognition of their significant pro-bono work.

Conditions

Applicant eligibility

Applicants must hold current senior instructor or director status in one of the following RACS programs:

ASSET, CCrISP®, CLEAR, EMST, OWR, TIPS

Eligible activity

The grant may be used to fund attendance at a relevant international course or conference, hospital visits or other activities that relate to the RACS skills training program content.

Selection

Selection will be based upon:

- the proposed activity's aim, background, rationale, benefits and outcomes as relevant to the program
- the expected contribution back to the related program as a result of the proposed activity
- the personal and professional development which may be achieved
- details of the approximate cost of the activity

The selection panel is comprised of the Chair and Deputy Chair of the Prevocational and Skills Education Committee (PSEC) and the Head of Education Services or the Skills Training Manager as their nominee.

Recipient obligations

The recipient agrees to be involved with a skills course program for a minimum of five years.

Acknowledgment

The grant is to be acknowledged by the recipient in all related communication as the Skills Training Faculty Grant (supported by the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons) and is to be accompanied by the Foundation for Surgery logo on all related presentations.
