Governing Policy: Research Scholarship Policy

Surgical Ethics Research Scholarship

The Surgical Ethics Research Scholarship supports surgeons and Trainees who wish to undertake higher degree research into ethical issues confronting surgery.

Conditions

Applicant eligibility

Applications are open to RACS Fellows, Specialist International Medical Graduates (SIMGs), SET Trainees and non RACS members with a special interest in the field who are sponsored by a RACS Fellow. Applicants must be enrolled (or intending to enrol) in a higher degree such as a Masters or PhD.

Eligible activity

A research project focusing on ethical issues confronting surgery, undertaken as part of a higher degree at an approved research institute under the supervision of an experienced investigator.

Selection

Selection is via assessment of the written application with shortlisted applicants invited to interview.

The selection panel is comprised of the Chair (or their nominee) and two members of the ANZ Scholarship and Grant Committee (ANZSGC).

Recipient obligations

Recipients are required to present their research at the annual meeting of the Surgical Research Society of Australasia (or an agreed equivalent) at least once during, or in the 12 months following the scholarship period.

Financial arrangements

The scholarship will be paid directly to the recipient upon receipt of a valid tax invoice as requested by the Scholarships and Grants department. Payment will be made in one instalment prior to 1 March in the scholarship year.

This scholarship is made up of a stipend component and a departmental component.
