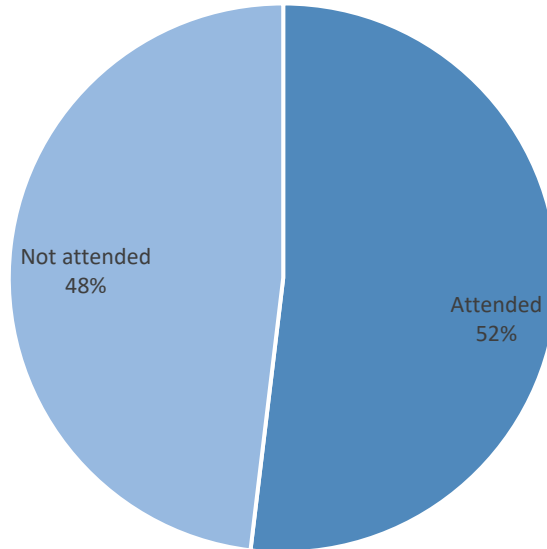

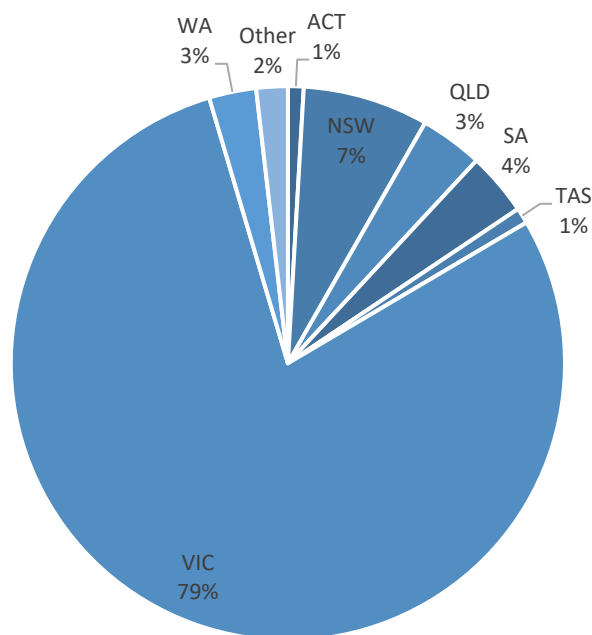

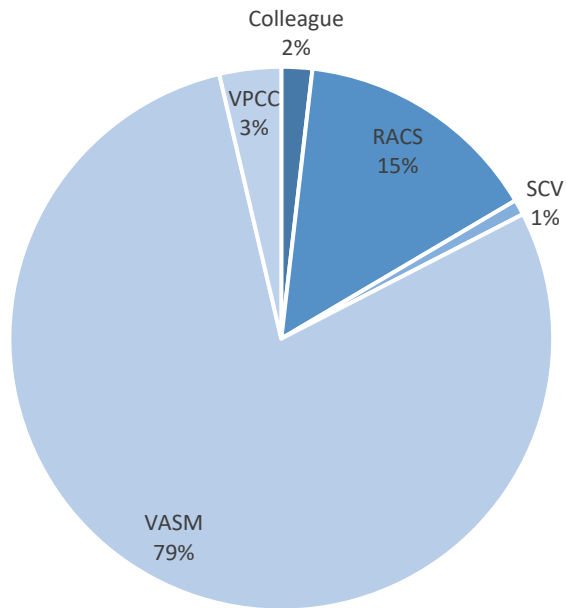
Total registrations.
(n=210)



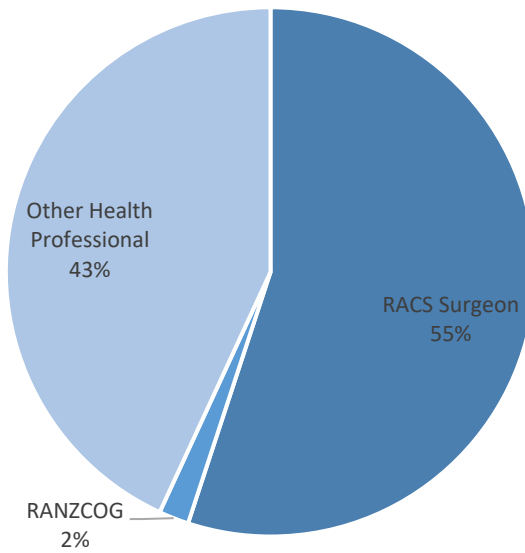
Total attendees by region.

(n=92/210)



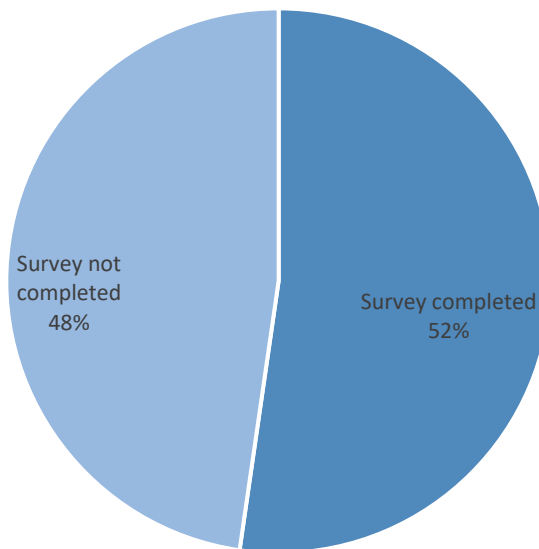
Attendees who were RACS and RANZCOG Fellows.
(n=62/210)



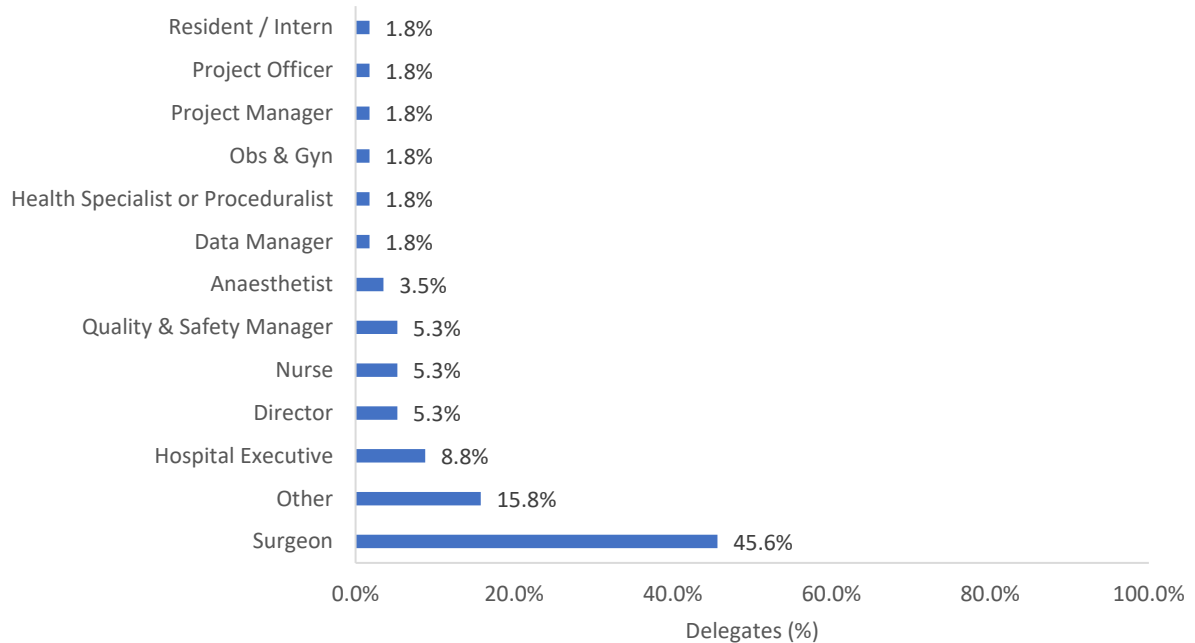
Webinar Survey Response – 3 February 2021

57 respondents out of 109 delegates who attended the webinar.

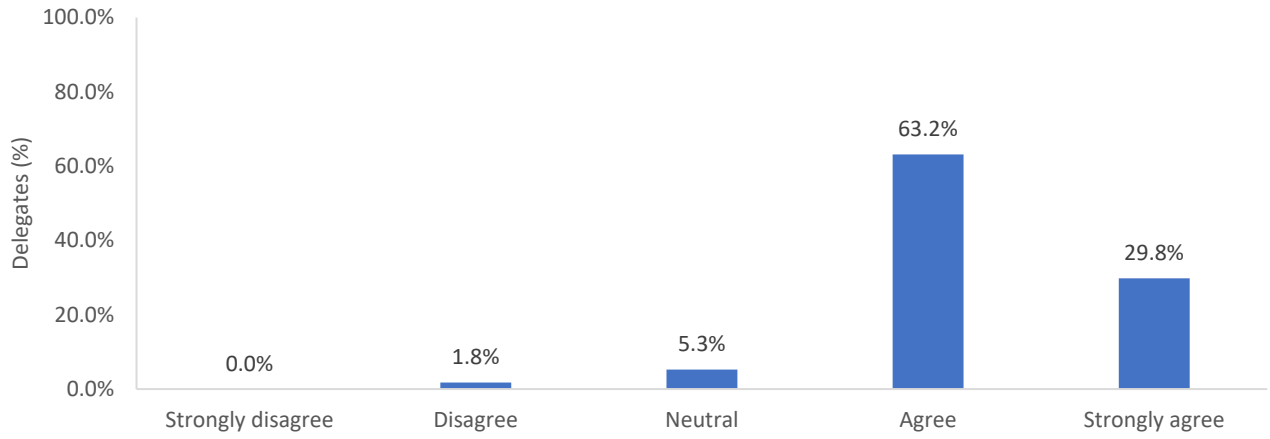
Attendees who completed survey.
(n=57/109)



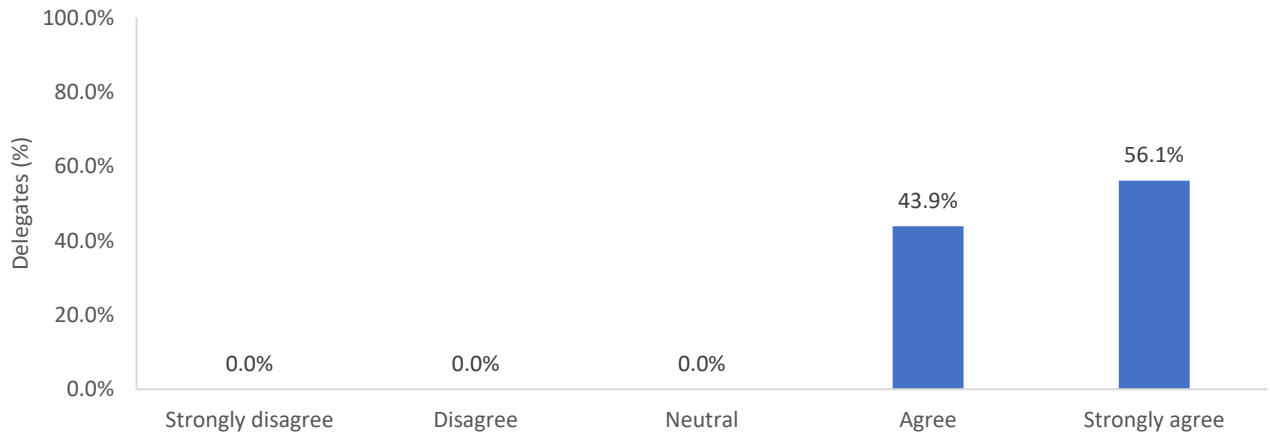
Attendees' professional role.
(n=57/109)



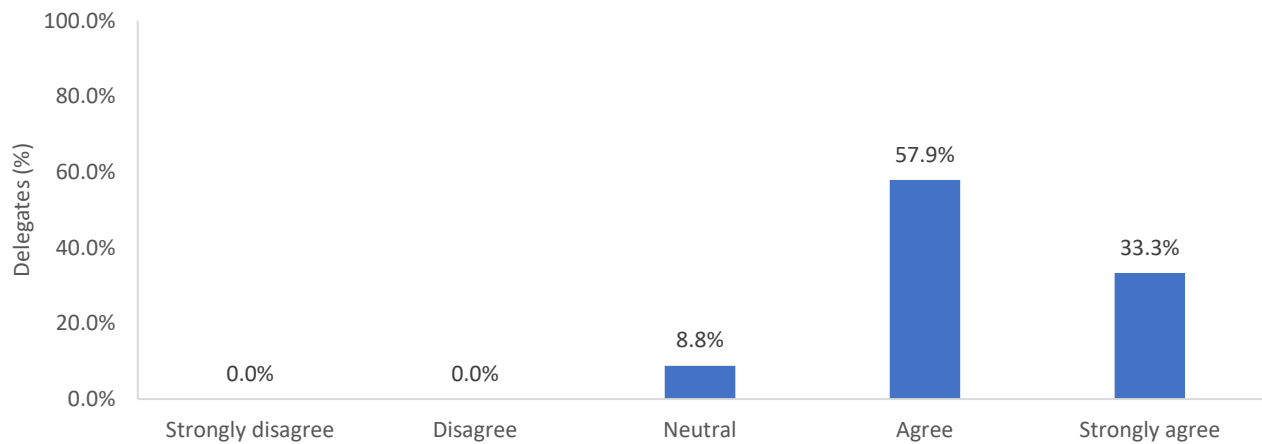
The session outcomes were explained.



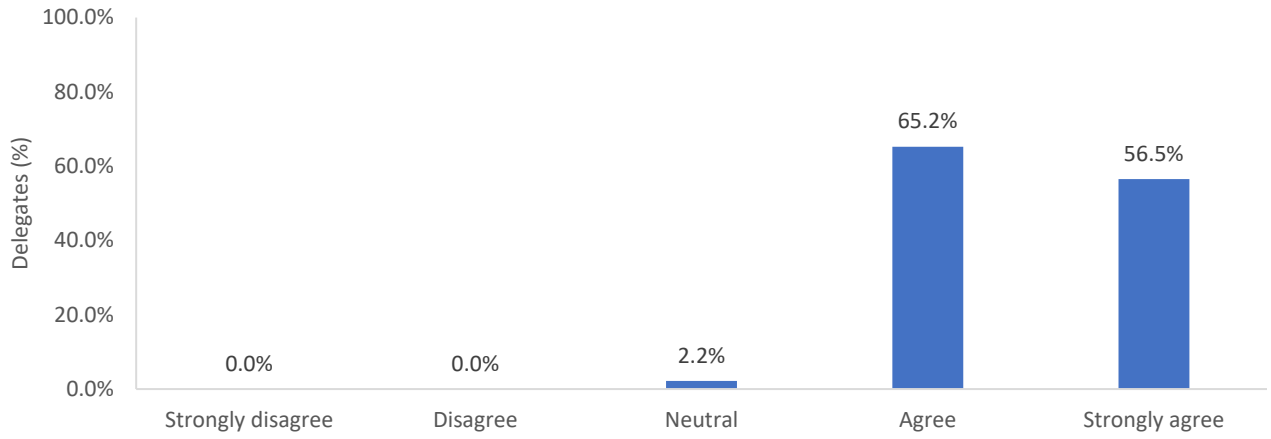
The session format as webinar was suitable.



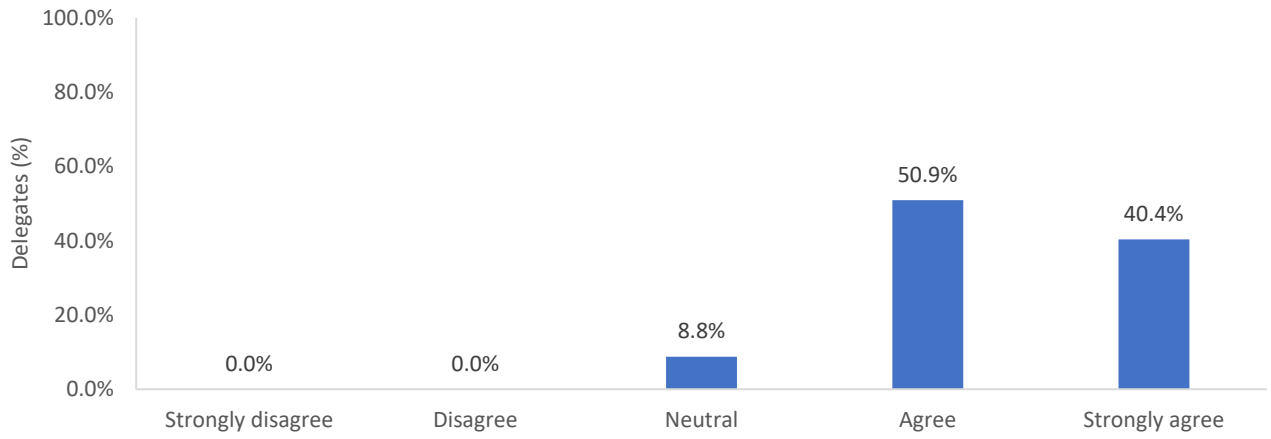

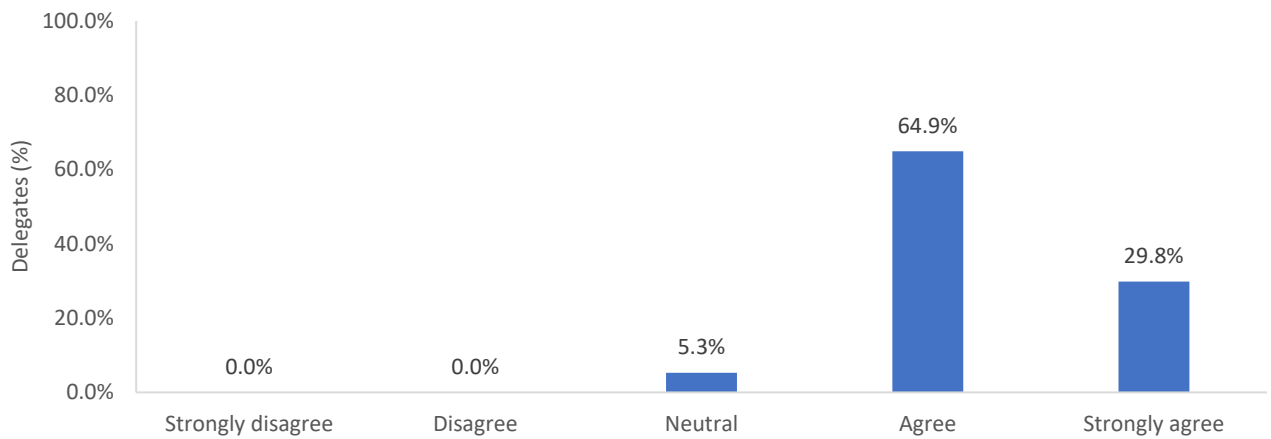

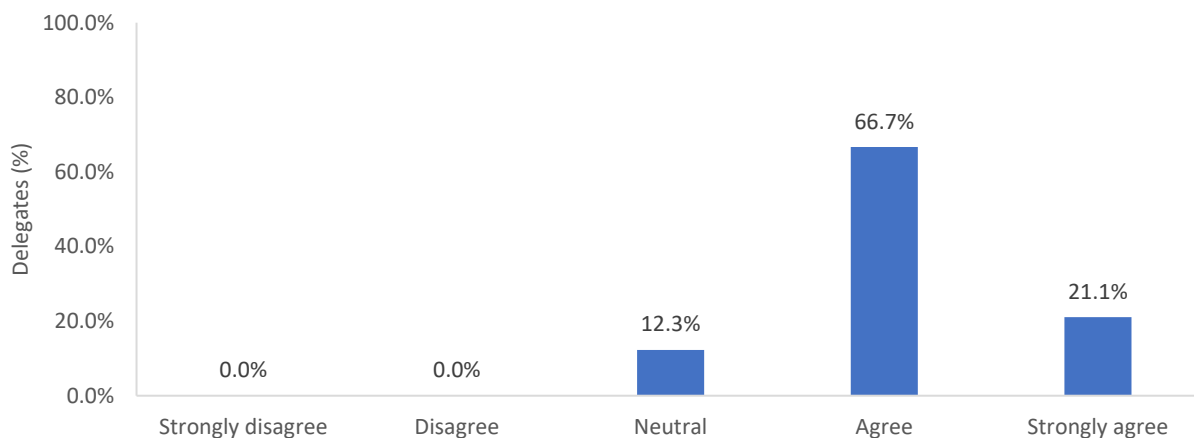
