




From February 2016, all MALT logbooks will be progressively moved to using SNOMED for their procedure lists. This guide describes the changes and provides examples and tips on using the enhanced user interface and additional report features.

CASE ENTRY

- Board approved terms are bolded and boosted in the search results (where applicable)
- Ability to enter non-board approved procedures
- Procedures can be marked as 'favourites' by clicking on  ('recently used' and 'most used' filters also available)
- Operative procedures and Non-operative Management (diagnoses/findings) can be entered in separate tabs
- Multiple procedures per case can be entered (previous board terms may now present as two terms)
- The 'Can't find your procedure' link sends a query email to the MALT helpdesk

All Procedures Logged Report

Qlikview is the Colleges Custom Reporting Tool which is attached to MALT and currently provides additional specialty training board reports.

The All Procedures Logged Report displays totals of procedures performed against supervision levels for logbooks that utilise a SNOMED procedure list. Unlike the Logbook Summary Report, this report can include all procedures, not just the “bolded” procedure terms that are required procedures set by training boards.
